s I sat on the porch that first afternoon, I felt so many emotions - fear, panic, hurt, wounded, unworthy, abandoned, betrayed, shocked and alone. But there were other things I felt too, like grateful, safe, and protected. I came to The Women's Shelter just over sixty days ago. Through a series of bad decisions, I found myself homeless and between the cracks. I had just enough money to temporarily get by but

not enough to get a place of my own with all of the luxuries of lights, food and water. When I called I was terrified. Miss Angie calmed me down, set me right and gave me entre into what has become a sanctuary and a home.

During my time here, I have begun to heal, find my true self again and

become a much stronger person. For the first time in my life someone told me that they had my back and meant it with no strings attached, and I believed it. Thus I am learning how to trust again. I have learned many life-improving lessons and skills so far on my journey here and I know that I am barely out of the driveway!

One of the most important lessons I have learned is that I have to be my own best friend. I have to love me and take care of me - no matter what is happening around me. I used to sacrifice myself for EVERYONE. I didn't take time

for me and gave my all to everyone around me - friends, family, work. At the end of the day there was nothing left for me but exhaustion, anxiety, and stress. Other people's problems were easier to deal with than my own.

I have learned that it's ok if I am not perfect because no one else is perfect either I am learning to live in the now and be happy. It is not selfish to make me happy. Now I

think of my past as a suitcase with limited space for my journey to the future. I only want to take the best stuff with me - good memories and important lessons. Finally I have learned to be still and trust, believe, and find comfort in God's love. God is always there - no strings attached - day or night. He won't abandon me or make me regret loving him.



So what does my future look like? That's an awesome question - I can truly say it is looking bright and happy now. I hope to enter school and complete a degree in medicine so that I can give back. I want to continue to grow and develop as an artist. One day I hope to live in my cottage by the ocean and tend my garden. This is a dream that would make me very happy. Now, thanks to The Women's Shelter, I can see my dreams coming true.
